

## Appendix Two - Summary Update

Public consultation on the Draft Vision CBD 2030 closed on 12 December 2008. In total, the Council received 105 submissions and a petition. Overall feedback received shows very positive support for the Draft Vision CBD 2030. The majority of submitters agreed that all six Themes are 'Definitely Important'.

Submitters selected the Vision Outcomes based on priority levels from 0 to 10; 10 being the highest priority. Essentially every Outcome was ranked 7 or above except one which was ranked at 6.9. There was no outcome that was ranked below 6.9. The table below shows the list of key Outcomes ranked by priority level. ## Where to from here

What comes after Vision CBD 2030? Two projects that are taking place in the first half of 2009 are as follows.

### CBD Making Places

How do we create a central business district (CBD) that is exciting, vibrant, creative, diverse, culturally rich, sustainable, and above all people friendly? We need to identify actions for a future CBD that better offers an exceptional quality of life within a sustainable blend of built and natural environment while considering population growth, economic growth, and lifestyle changes toward 2030.

Council project 'CBD Making Places' will examine how to unlock the potential for our CBD by using the findings of the recent Council project 'Vision CBD 2030' (which outlines key concepts of a shared vision for the CBD) to produce a framework in mid 2009 to guide long term strategic opportunities for the CBD. 'CBD Making Places' includes comprehensive design and contextual analysis of the existing urban environment and its qualities, features and characteristics, key issues, constraints and opportunities, including traffic, transport, economic and social issues. Spatial and development concept for the area will be articulated through drawings, sketches, maps and supporting explanatory text. ### Hutt City Central District Plan Review

Discussion Document - The purpose of the Discussion Document is to describe the Council's understanding of issues facing the Central Area and the options to address these through the District Plan. The aim is to set a District Plan platform for the next 10 years that will provide direction to the community, landowners, investors and other stakeholders as to how Council manages the Central Area to provide opportunities for growth as well as the quality and types of growth that will benefit the city in the long term.
