Getting to Te Rā o Te Raukura

By Car: Te Whiti Park is only 20mins drive from Central Wellington. Exit SH2 at Petone and follow The Esplanade to Hutt Park roundabout. Turn left into Randwick Rd and follow over railway overbridge turning right at Roundabout (towards Wainuiomata). Continue over 2nd overbridge on Whites Line East. Continue on Whites Line East until Te Whiti Park.

By Rail: Catch the Hutt Valley Line (Wellington - Upper Hutt) and stop at Woburn Station. Te Whiti Park is a short walk down Cambridge Tce on to Whites Line East (10 mins). For further public transport information phone Metlink on 801 7000 or visit www.metlink.org.nz

Parking

Car parking is available on Te Whiti Park via the Whites Line East entrance. This is charged at \$5 per car. Other parking is available in designated parking spaces on the streets of around Te Whiti Park.
